

# **Economic sanctions on North Korea**

### Why in news?

Recently following new UN sanctions, China announced that it will halt iron, iron ore and seafood imports from North Korea.

#### What is the reason for economic sanctions on North Korea?

\n

- It successfully tested the Hwasong 14 ICBM. n
- After the second test, it appears that the missile could travel up to 10,000 km.

∖n

- It is enough to hit the US mainland, and possibly even cities like Chicago, New York, or Washington, DC.
- This move is to punish the regime for developing such ballistic missiles.  $\ensuremath{\sc n}$

### What does this economic sanctions include?

∖n

- **Exports** The tough new sanctions would prohibit export of North Korean coal, iron, iron ore, lead, lead ore, and seafood.
- These industries account for about a third of all of North Korean exports.  $\slash n$
- Investments It sets new limits on North Korea's Foreign Trade Bank by

banning new joint ventures between North Korea and foreign companies.  $\ensuremath{\sc n}$ 

- It prohibits new foreign investments in North Korean ventures, and caps the number of workers the country can send abroad.  $\n$

## What is the trade relationship of China with N.Korea?

- China accounts for 90% of North Korea's trade.  $\slash n$
- China imported \$74.4 million worth of iron ore in the first five months of this year, almost equalling the figure for all of 2016. n
- Fish and seafood imports totalled \$46.7 million in June 2017.  $\nline{\nline{n}}$
- Beijing had already announced a suspension of coal imports in February.  $\space{\space{1.5}\spac$

### What is the significance of China's move?

∖n

 USA has been pressuring Beijing to take a harder stance against North Korea.

∖n

- China voted for the measure in UN, after repeated accusation from US that China is not doing enough to harness in its neighbour.  $\n$
- Given that China is North Korea's largest trading partner, this move is expected to be effective.  $\n$

## What are the issues with this sanction?

• It's unclear whether it will curtail the nation's weapons program.

∖n

- Past sanctions have not discouraged the regime in its quest to develop nuclear weapons.
  - \n
- The sanctions would punish North Korean leaders in particular.  $\slash n$
- It's unclear how the sanctions will impact ordinary citizens.  $\slash n$
- It is doubtful whether china will keep its commitments for maintaining the sanctions.  $\sc{n}$
