



North Korea Missile Test

Why in news?

North Korea tested another intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) that appears to have the range to hit major US cities.

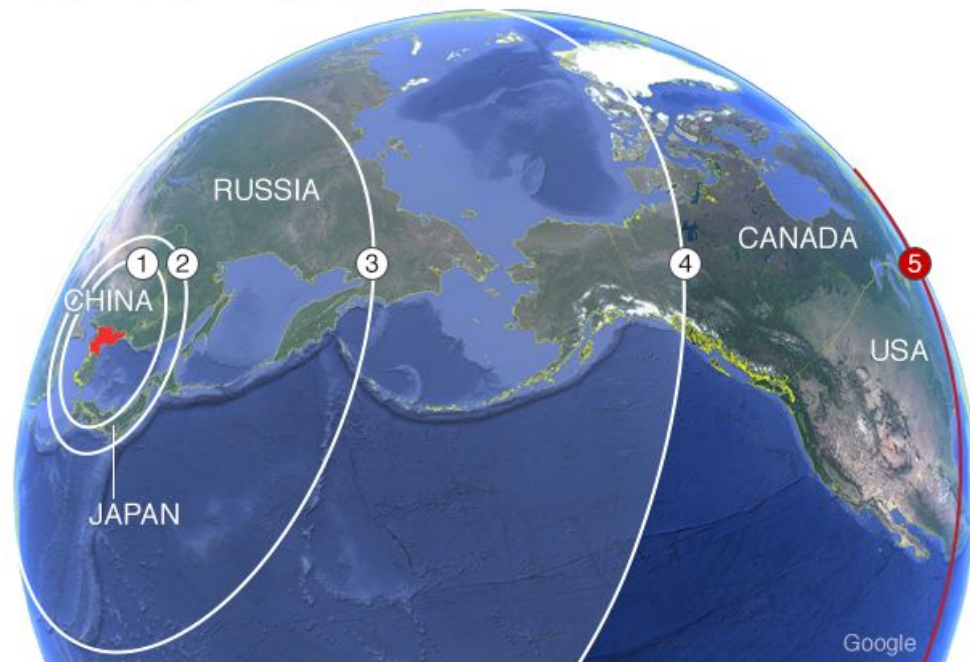
What is the significance?

- \n
- If North Korea's claims about the test are true, Pyongyang may be even further advanced in its missile program than was previously thought.
\n
- If the missile were fired on a flatter, standard trajectory, it would have major US cities like Los Angeles, Denver and Chicago well within its range.
\n
- It even has the ability to reach as far as New York City and Boston.
\n
- South Korea's joint chiefs of staff said they estimate that the ICBM is more advanced than one launched earlier this July.
\n
- But the test cannot determine how heavy a payload the missile was carrying in its warhead. The heavier the payload, the shorter the range.
\n
- Also, despite the ongoing tests, experts believe the North does not yet have the capability to miniaturise a nuclear warhead, fit it on to a long-range missile, and ensure it is protected until delivery to the target.
\n
- However, this latest missile test shows the **US' actions are not changing North Korea's behavior** and it's time for Donald Trump to articulate a comprehensive strategy.

- Kim Jong Un is quoted as saying that **the whole US mainland** is now within North Korea's reach.

\n

- US President Trump condemned North Korea's launch and said it only threatens the world, further isolate North Korea, weaken its economy, and deprive its people.

\n

- Hours later, the US and South Korean military conducted a live fire exercise as a show of force in response to the missile test.

\n

- China issued a statement condemning the missile launch and asked Pyongyang to "stop taking actions that would escalate tensions" on the Korean Peninsula.

\n

- Meanwhile, US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson said China and Russia need to do more to stop North Korea's missile program.
