#### **Government Agencies to Monitor Computers**

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- Union Home Ministry has recently issued a notification allowing 10 government agencies to monitor and decrypt any information stored in any computer on grounds of internal security.
- It is in accordance with the power conferred upon the government under Section 69 of the Information Technology Act, 2000.  $\n$
- The agencies will now be able to snoop on exchange of information and material between individuals and banned or militant groups.  $\n$
- Each case of interception, monitoring, decryption is to be approved by the Union home secretary and reviewed every 2 months by the cabinet secretary.  $\n$
- The central agencies being given power under the notification are,  $\slash n$

- 2. Narcotics Control Bureau, n
- 3. Enforcement Directorate, n
- 4. Central Board of Direct Taxes, \n
- 5. Directorate of Revenue Intelligence, n

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- 8. Cabinet Secretariat (R&AW), n
- 9. Directorate of Signal Intelligence (for service areas of Jammu and Kashmir, North-East and Assam only) and
- 10. The Commissioner of Police, Delhi. n

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# Pokkali Paddy

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- Pokkali paddy variety is a saltwater-tolerant paddy grown in the coastal fields of Alappuzha, Ernakulam and Thrissur districts of Kerala.  $\n$
- It is endemic to Kerala and was given Geographical Indication (GI) tag.  $\space{\space{1.5}n}$
- It grows to a height of up to 2 m and it survived the recent devastating floods in farmlands across the State.  $\n$
- The single-season paddy is raised in saltwater fields between June and November followed by a season of fish-farming.  $\n$
- After the harvest, the paddy stubble in the fields acts as food and shelter for shrimp and small fish.  $\n$
- Fish excreta and scales, along with the decomposed stubble, provide excellent natural manure for another season of Pokkali.
- The cultivation is labour intensive and this farming tradition is under threat due to lack of labour.  $\$

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### **States' Startup Ranking**

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• The Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion (DIPP) announced results of the first ever States' Start-up Ranking 2018 recently.

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• The key objective of the exercise was to encourage States/UT to take

proactive steps towards strengthening the Start-up ecosystems in their states.

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- The States have been identified under different categories Start-up policy leaders, incubation hubs, seeding innovation, scaling innovation, regulatory change champions, procurement leaders, communication champions, North-Eastern leader, and hill state leader.
- Based on these categories, the States have been recognised as the Best Performer, Top Performers, Leaders, Aspiring Leaders, Emerging States and Beginners.

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- Gujarat has been identified as the **best performer.**  $\slash n$
- Karnataka, Kerala, Odisha, and Rajasthan have been identified as the top performers.

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• Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, and Telangana have been identified as leaders.

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#### Windfarm in Norway

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• Norway is planning to build megawatt Storheia wind park in Northwest coast.
