Illegal encroachments in Assam

Notices issued by the Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council (KAAC) to evict illegal settlers from the grazing reserves have sparked unrest in Assam.


- **Issue** Encroachment by illegal settlers and construction of temporary and permanent structures on Professional Grazing Reserves (PGR) and Village Grazing Reserves (VGR).
- The PGR was announced by the British government in 1933 and its boundary was demarcated in 1946.
- The KAAC said that the decision was in line with a Supreme Court order and the Karbi Anglong (Land & Revenue) Act of 1953.

In Jagpal Singh & Others v. State of Punjab, the Supreme Court has urged that states to take necessary measures for the eviction of illegal occupants of Gram Sabha or Gram Panchayat lands.

• **Mission Basundhara 4.0** - Assam Government has proposed to launch the mission to reclaim the chars (sandbars or river islands) from encroachers to safeguard the ecological integrity of the Brahmaputra Valley.

Quick Facts

- **KAAC** It is one of the 10 Autonomous District Councils administered under the 6^{th} Schedule.
- The KAAC administers the tribal-majority Karbi Anglong and West Karbi Anglong districts of Assam.
- **6**th **Schedule** It contains provisions related to the administration of tribal areas in the states of <u>Assam, Meghalaya, Tripura and Mizoram</u>.
- Currently, there are $\underline{10 \text{ ADCs}}$ under the 6th Schedule in the North East Region.

Egg-Freezing

Indian cities are becoming hotspots of the global fertility tourism market due to its competitive cost and high success rate.

- **Egg-freezing** It is an Assisted Reproductive Technology (ART) in which a woman's eggs (oocytes) are extracted, frozen and stored as a method to preserve reproductive potential in women of reproductive age.
- **Process** It involves the hyper stimulation of the ovaries with hormones, which leads them to release *more than one egg per cycle*.
- The egg is then retrieved and flash-frozen unfertilised in a process called *vitrification* to minimise ice crystal formation, and stored in *liquid nitrogen* to preserve it until the donor wishes to opt for pregnancy.
- When opted for pregnancy, the egg is then thawed, combined with sperm in an <u>*IVF*</u> (*in-vitro fertilization*) lab and the fertilized embryo transplanted into the uterus.
- The process is also known by the name *Oocyte Cryopreservation*.

The Indian Society for Assisted Reproduction (ISAR) has claimed that there is a

10-25% rise in egg-freezing procedures compared to the years before Covid-19.

- **Time Period** Under Assisted Reproductive Technology (Regulation) Act, 2021, eggs can be stored for <u>up to 10 years</u>, after which they are destroyed or donated for research.
- Cost <u>1 lakh to 5 lakh</u> and it is almost 1/3rd of that in advanced economies causing India as a global fertility tourism market.

Quick Facts

Anti-Müllerian Hormone (AMH) Test

• The test measures the amount of AMH in a blood sample.

• In males, AMH is made by the testicles (or testes), which are glands that make sperm and male hormones.

• In females, the ovaries make AMH.

• The ovaries are glands where eggs form and female hormones are made.

Nordic-Baltic Eight (NB8)

The India-Nordic-Baltic Eight (NB8) meeting was held recently on the sidelines of the Raisina Dialogue, 2024 in New Delhi.

- **NB8** A regional framework consisting of 8 countries from the Northern Europe.
- Members -
 - **5 Nordic Countries** Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway, and Sweden.
 - **3 Baltic countries** Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania.
- Established in 1992
- **Aim** To discuss important regional and international issues in an informal atmosphere.
- Chair In 2024, the NB8 is chaired by <u>Sweden</u> which was taken over from <u>Latvia</u>.
- NB8 Wise Men Report It is also known as Birkavs-Gade Report.
- It provides concrete guidelines for promoting cooperation between the 8 countries.
- **e-PINE** Enhanced Partnership in Northern Europe (e-PINE) was launched by the United States in 2003.

Buffalo fights & Bulbul fights

People for Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) have mounted a legal challenge against the practices of buffalo and bulbul fighting in the Gauhati High Court.

- These fights are part of the folk culture associated with the <u>Assamese</u> winter harvest festival of <u>Magh Bihu</u>.
- Moh Juj It is a traditional *buffalo fight* organized in Assam.
- **Bulbuli** It is a traditional *bird fight* organized in Assam.

This traditional folk culture was recently organized in January 2024 after a 9 years ban.

Magh Bihu

- Magh Bihu, also known as Bhogali Bihu or Maghor Bihu, is a harvesting festival celebrated in *Assam*.
- The festival has its roots in the agricultural traditions of Assam and falls in the month of Magh, which falls in January.
- It marks the end of the harvesting season, and it is celebrated in other parts of the country such as *Makar Sankranti, Pongal and Lohri*.

• It is the largest animal rights organisation in the world.

Amendment -

Sepahijala Wildlife sanctuary

- Sepahijala Wildlife Sanctuary is located in *Tripura*.
- The sanctuary was established in 1972.

• It is famous for its "Clouded Leopard enclosure" and <u>Clouded Leopard</u> <u>National Park</u> is a part of SWL.

• It has 2 natural lakes, namely Abasarika and Amrit Sagar.

Kiru Hydel Project

• The Kiru Hydroelectric Power Project is a run-of-river scheme on the <u>Chenab</u> <u>River</u> in <u>Jammu and Kashmir</u> to be completed in 2025.

• It is being constructed between the existing <u>Kirthai II and Kwar hydel</u> power projects.

• It will be developed near the convergence point of river <u>Chenab and the</u> <u>Singad and Bela</u> streams.

Gemma

Google has recently introduced Gemma, latest open artificial intelligence (AI) model.

Gemma is a family of open-source AI models developed by Google DeepMind.
Its name is derived from the Latin word <u>'*aemma*</u>, which translates to precious

stone.

• It has been built using the same research and technology used in <u>Gemini</u> <u>models</u> by Google.

• Gemma is being offered in 2 model sizes, Gemma 2B and Gemma 7B, which have been released with pre-trained and instruction-tuned variants.

J0529-4351

Scientists has recently discovered the fastest-growing black hole known to date in the quasar named Jo529-4351.

• The object was first detected using a 2.3-m telescope at the Australian National University.

• The quasar is so far away from our planet that its light took more than <u>12</u> <u>billion years</u> to reach us.

• Quasars are the known as the brightest objects in the sky thus J0529-4351 is over <u>500 trillion times</u> more luminous than the Sun.

Spur-winged lapwing (Vanellus spinosus)

Recently, a birdwatching team from Telangana for the first time spotted a spurwinged lapwing near Warangal.

• The spur-winged lapwing (Vanellus spinosus) is a wading bird in <u>Charadriidae</u> <u>family</u>, native to North Africa, the Middle East and Mediterranean regions.

• It is abundant in tropical Africa and can be found at almost any wetland habitat in its range.

• The spur-winged lapwing is a carnivore that eats insects, insect larvae, and small invertebrates.

- IUCN- Least Concern.

Dosti-16

The 16thedition of the Dosti-16 exercise has been recently concluded with observers from Bangladesh.

• Dosti-16 is a trilateral exercise between the coast guards of <u>India, the</u> <u>Maldives, and Sri Lanka</u>.

• The exercise aims to improve maritime interoperability, enhance cooperation, and strengthen friendship.

• The exercise has been held <u>every 2 years</u> since 1991, except in 2021.

Cerrado savannah

• The Cerrado is a *tropical savanna ecoregion* in South America.

• It's the *world's most biodiverse savanna*, home to 5% of the planet's animals and plants.

• The Cerrado covers mainly within *Brazil* and extending into parts of Bolivia and Paraguay.

U Tirot Sing

A statue of U Tirot Sing was unveiled recently at Indira Gandhi Cultural Centre, Dhaka.

• Tirot Sing is a tribal chief known as '<u>the Hero of the Khasi Hills</u>' of Meghalaya against the British colonizers.

• He was born in **1802** and died in Dhaka on July 17, 1835.

• Every year on July 17, Meghalaya commemorates U Tirot Sing Day.

Skill India Centre in Odisha

Union Minister of Education and Skill Development inaugurated the 1st Skill India Centre (SIC) in, Odisha recently.

• The SIC will play a pivotal role in designing curriculum along with industry experts to promote standardization and create employment opportunities across industries.

• It aims to leverage modern technologies, gain technology-driven learning experiences and explore potential career avenues with renowned organizations.

• The training process will be implemented by *National Skill Development*

<u>Corporation (NSDC).</u>

Special Tiger Protection Force

Arunachal Pradesh recently signs MoU with NTCA to raise first special tiger protection force.

• It is the *Arunachal's* 1st *Special Tiger Protection Force (STPC)* in order to revamp conservation efforts.

• The special force would be deployed in the frontier state's 3 tiger reserves, Namdapha, Kamlang and Pakke.
