- The Commission was established in May 2010 with the aim of boosting the importance of broadband on the international policy agenda. \n
- Following adoption of the UN's Sustainable Development Goals in 2015, the Commission was re-launched as the Broadband Commission for Sustainable Development.

- Its aim is to showcase and document the power of ICT and broadband-based technologies for sustainable development.
- The Commission has re-evaluated and launched new framework of Targets

2025 in support of "Connecting the Other Half" of the world's population. \n

Kaleshwaram project

- The Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project's enormous benefits come at an irrecoverable cost -- loss of forest cover to an extent of over 7,800 acres. \n
- The project will forever bisect the contiguous forest between Maharashtra and Telangana and between Warangal and Adilabad, leading to genetic isolation of species.

∖n

- The flora of this region constitute of 391 species while the fauna is also a rich mixture of amphibians, mammals , butterflies and dragonflies. \n
- A total of 22 lakh forest trees will be removed to accommodate canals, reservoirs and other structures of the project leading to habitat destruction of flora and fauna of the region.
