- It is also known by the name Hargila. IS Empowering
- They are found across South and Southeast Asia.
- The Greater Adjutant stork is the second-rarest stork species in the world.
- It is one of the most threatened stork species in the world.
- There are only three known breeding grounds for them, one in Cambodia, and two in India (Assam & Bihar).

Ambition on Meting Ice (AMI)

- At the meeting at COP27, a new high-level group 'Ambition on Melting Ice on Sea-level Rise and Mountain Water Resources' came into existence.
- The group is a broad coalition of 18 governments, led by the two polar and mountain nations of Chile and Iceland.
- The "AMI" group aims to ensure impacts of cryosphere loss are understood by political leaders and the public, and not only within mountain and polar region, but throughout the planet.
- **Declaration** Climate change already has caused dramatic changes in the global cryosphere, Earth's snow and ice regions.
- Severe impacts are already occurring in relation to water shortages from shrinking glaciers and snowpack; global sea-level rise due to loss of ice from ice sheets, glaciers and ocean warming; and landslides triggered by permafrost thaw.
- Lives and livelihoods are threatened by, and some already lost from, these changes.
- Indigenous peoples in both the Arctic and mountain regions have been among the earliest affected.

United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC)

• It was established in the year 1997 by merging the United Nations Drug Control Programme and the Centre for International Crime Prevention.

- UNODC is the global leader in the light against illicit drugs and international crime.
- It relies on voluntary contributions, mainly from Governments, for 90% of its budget.
- It is mandated to assist member states in their struggle against illicit drugs, crime and terrorism.
- The World Drug Report is released once in a year.

Sounding Rockets

- Sounding rockets are one or two stage solid propellant rockets used for probing the upper atmospheric regions and for space research.
- With the establishment of the Thumba Equatorial Rocket Launching Station (TERLS) in 1963 at Thumba, there was a quantum jump in the scope for aeronomy and atmospheric sciences in India.
- The launch of the first sounding rocket was from Thumba on 21 November 1963.
- ISRO has developed a series of sounding rockets called Rohini series.
- ISRO started launching indigenously made sounding rockets from 1965 and experience gained was of immense value in the mastering of solid propellant technology.

Trading + One day (T+1) Settlement

- Under the T+1 settlement cycle, investors get their money or shares delivered within 24 hours.
- Earlier, F&O stocks were to be transitioned to the T+1 settlement in two batches.
- It is an initiative of the Securities and Exchange Board of India.
- India followed the T+3 settlement system, meaning it took three days for shares and money to be credited to the account.
- In 2003, SEBI introduced the T+2 settlement system.
- The settlement marks the official transfer of shares to the buyer's account and cash to the seller's account.
- Sebi, when proposing the plan said it was receiving requests from various stakeholders to shorten the settlement cycle.
