- 1) Consider the following statements about Kurile Islands
  - 1. It is an island archipelago in the Pacific Ocean, lying between Russia and Japan.
  - 2. It is of volcanic origin.
  - 3. It comes under the jurisdiction of Japan.

Which of the statement(s) given above is/are correct?

- a. 1 only
- b. 1 & 2 only
- c. 2 & 3 only
- d. All of the above

#### Answer: b

• The Kuriles are an archipelago of some 56 islands spanning about 1,800 km from Japan's Hokkaido to Russia's Kamchatka.



- All of them are under Russian jurisdiction but Japan claims the two large southernmost islands, Etorofu and Kunashiri, and two others, Shikotan and Habomai, as its 'northern territories'.
- These islands were occupied by the Soviet Union in August 1945, after which the entire Japanese population, numbering less than 20,000, was evicted.
- Despite the passage of over 70 years, this dispute has defied solution and prevented the conclusion of a Russo-Japanese peace treaty

- 2) Consider the following statements regarding Dynamic Pricing Policy
  - 1. This means that the prices fuels are changed daily by the Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) based on the movement of international crude oil prices.

- 4) "MP Bezbarauah committee" was sometimes seen in the news recently. It was constituted for which of the following purposes?
  - a. Issues with Start-ups
  - b. Implementation of Assam Accord
  - c. Review dynamic pricing policy
  - d. Investigate Meghalaya mine crisis

#### Answer: b

- The government has notified a High-Level Committee for implementation of Clause six of the Assam Accord.
- The nine-member committee, comprising of eminent Assamese persons from different fields, is headed by former bureaucrat *MP Bezbarauah*.
- The committee will examine the effectiveness of actions since 1985 to implement Clause 6 of the Assam Accord.
- 5) Consider the following statements with respect to *Agasthyarkoodam peak* 
  - 1. It is the second highest peak south of satpura range.
  - 2. It is located within the Shendurney wildlife sanctuary.

Which of the statement(s) given above is/are correct?

- a. 1 only
- b. 2 only
- c. Both 1 and 2

#### Answer: d

- Agasthyarkoodam is the second highest peak in Kerala at 1,868 metres in the Neyyar Wildlife Sanctuary, Thiruvananthapuram.
- The peak is named after a mythical Hindu sage Agasthya.
- *Kerala's Kani tribe* has claimed that they have been traditionally worshipping the idol of Agasthya Muni atop the hill and it was customary for women not to go near the idol.
- Last year, the Kerala High Court had ruled that no gender-based restrictions can be imposed on those who intend to trek Agasthyarkoodam, and lifted the unofficial ban on the entry of women to the peak.
- 6) Consider the following statements with respect to Mercury
  - 1. It is the only metal to be liquid at room temperature.
  - 2. It mixes with the environment due to both natural and anthropogenic activity.

Which of the statement(s) given above is/are correct?

- a. 1 only
- b. 2 only
- c. Both 1 and 2

#### Answer: c

- Mercury is a *heavy metal* that is predominant in the environment.
- It mixes with the environment due to **both natural** (e.g. volcanic activity) and **anthropogenic** (e.g. electrical appliances such as mercury lamps) activity.
- It is the only metal to be liquid at room temperature.

7) "Financial Stability Report (FSR)" was published by which of the following organisations?

- a. World Bank
- b. World Economic Forum
- c. International Monetary Fund
- d. None of the above

#### Answer: d

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is releasing the Financial Stability Report bi-annually.
- The *Global* Financial Stability Report (GFSR) is a semi-annual report by the *International Monetary Fund (IMF)* that assesses the stability of global financial markets and emerging-market financing.
- It is released twice per year, in April and October.
- 8) Consider the following statements with respect to Cyclone Pabuk
  - 1. It originated over the Andaman Sea and its neighbourhood.
  - 2. The name Pabuk was given by Bangladesh.

Which of the statement(s) given above is/are correct?

- a. 1 only
- b. 2 only
- c. Both 1 and 2
- d. Neither 1 nor 2

#### Answer: d

• Pabuk originated over the *Gulf of Thailand and its neighbourhood*.

- Pabuk is a name given by *Laos* and means a 'big fresh water fish'.
- The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued an Orange alert for the Andaman Islands as cyclonic storm Pabuk is moving north-northwestwards.
- 9) "Mapping and Review Exercise of Child Care Institutions Report" was released recently by which of the following?
  - a. Bachpan Bachao Andolan
  - b. Ministry of Women and Child Development
  - c. National Center for Missing and Exploited Children
  - d. None of the above

#### Answer: b

- Ministry of Women and Child Development recently released a report titled 'Mapping and Review Exercise of Child Care Institutions'.
- 10) Consider the following statements with respect to Phuti masjid
  - 1. It was built by Sarfaraz Khan, the nawab of Murshidabad.
  - 2. It is renowned for its construction which was completed in 5 years.

Which of the statement(s) given above is/are correct?

## RLIAME Answer: a • It was built by Sarfaraz Khan, the nawab of Murshidabad.

- Phuti masjid is guite large with four cupolas at the corners.
- Only two of its five planned domes were completed. As the builder died soon after construction began, the mosque was never completed.
- And so the name Phuti Masjid, or **broken mosque**. It is also known rather morbidly as Fouti Masjid. 'Fout' means death, and the name was apparently given after the builder's death.
