1) *Extinction Rebellion movement* sometimes seen in the news recently is associated with which of the following?

Answer : c

• Extinction Rebellion is an international socio-political movement which uses nonviolent resistance to avert climate breakdown, halt biodiversity loss, and minimise the risk of human extinction and ecological collapse.

It has three core demands:

- 1. For the government to "tell the truth about climate change"
- 2. To reduce carbon emissions to zero by 2025
- 3. To create a citizens' assembly to oversee progress.
- 2) Consider the following statements with respect to Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY)
 - 1. It aims to provide accidental insurance cover at a very affordable premium of Rs.12/year.
 - 2. The scheme is being offered only by Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC).

Answer:d

- PMJJBY offers coverage for *death due to any reason* and is available to people in the age group of 18 to 50 years (life cover up to age 55) having a savings bank account who gives their consent to join and enable auto debit.
- A life cover of Rs. 2 lakhs is available for a one year period at a premium of Rs.330/- per annum per member and is renewable every year.
- It is administered through *LIC and other Indian private Life Insurance companies*.

3) Consider the following statements with respect to *East Asian-Australasian Flyway Partnership*

- 1. It is a part of United Nation Environment Programme (UNEP) and was adopted in the list of the World Summit on Sustainable Development (WSSD).

- The East Asian-Australasian Flyway Partnership (EAAFP) is a network of partners within the East Asian-Australasian Flyway (EAAF).
- It aims to protect migratory water birds, their habitat and the livelihoods of people dependent upon them.
- The Flyway is one of 9 major migratory routes recognised globally.
- It was adopted in the list of the World Summit on Sustainable Development as a Type II initiative which is *informal and voluntary*. (*It is not a part of UN*)
- There are currently 37 Partners including 18 countries, 6 intergovernmental agencies, 12 international non-governmental organisations (NGOs) and 1 international private enterprise.
- 4) A Global Deal for Nature (GDN) sometimes seen in the news recently refers to which of the following?
 - a. It is a plan to save the diversity and abundance of life on Earth
 - b. It is an intergovernmental initiative to protect forests and grasslands
 - c. It is an UN mission that aims to reduce carbon emissions to zero by $2050\,$

- The Global Deal for Nature is a time-bound, science-based plan to save the diversity and abundance of life on Earth.
- Scientists has recently proposed this plan to prevent another mass extinction event on the planet.

The three overarching goals of the GDN are

- 1. To protect biodiversity by conserving at least 30 per cent of the Earth's surface by 2030
- 2. Mitigate climate change by conserving the Earth's natural carbon storehouses
- 3. Reduce major threats

5) Consider the following statements with respect to National Bamboo Mission (NBM)

- 1. It aims to increase the area under bamboo plantation in government's forest lands and also in private lands to supplement farm income and contribute towards resilience to climate change.

Answer : b

- The main objective of *National Bamboo Mission (NBM)* is to increase the area under bamboo plantation in *non-forest* Government lands and private lands to supplement farm income and contribute towards resilience to climate change as well as availability of quality raw material requirement of industries.
- The bamboo plantations will be promoted predominantly in farmers' fields, homesteads,

community lands, arable wastelands, and along irrigation canals, water bodies etc.

• The NBM will be a sub scheme of National Mission on Sustainable Agriculture (NMSA) under the umbrella scheme Krishonnati Yojana.

- **Radio Detection and Ranging (RADAR)** works by sending radio signals towards an object and receiving the signals that are reflected by the object.
- The reflected signals can be seen on a screen.

Applications

- In airports it is used to help planes land safely
- Weather forecasters use it to locate rain and snow clouds
- Ships' captains use radar while travelling through fog and mist
- On land, policemen use radar to detect speeding cars
- In geophysics, radars so called GPR-Systems, are used to analyze the ground **to create soil profiles**

7) Consider the following statements with respect to *East Asian-Australasian Flyway (EAAF)*



- The East Asia/Australasia Flyway is one of 9 major migratory routes recognised globally.
- The Flyway extends from Arctic Russia and North America to the southern limits of Australia and New Zealand.
- It encompasses large parts of East Asia, all of Southeast Asia and includes eastern India and the *Andaman and Nicobar Islands*.
- Researchers have recently discovered that for the first time, East Asian birds have made the Great Nicobar Island as their stopover for a few week rest before they can fly along the East Asian-Australasian Flyway (EAAF).
