- At present, a party is recognised as a national party *if any* of the following conditions is fulfilled:
- 1. If it secures six per cent of valid votes polled in *any four or more states* at a general election to the Lok Sabha or to the legislative assembly; and, in addition, it wins four seats in the Lok Sabha from any state or states; or
- 2. If it wins two per cent of seats in the Lok Sabha at a general election; and these candidates are elected from three states; or
- 3. If it is recognised as a state party in four states.
- In its recent order, the ECI has said that the National People's Party (NPP) was given the national party status for fulfilling conditions such as polling more than 6% of the total votes in the last general election and being recognised as a State party in at least four States.
- The NPP is recognised as a State party in Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya and Nagaland.


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- The commission consist of a *Chairperson* who, is a person of eminence and has done a outstanding work for promoting the welfare of children; and *Six members*.
