Concerns in the parliament sessions

- ① ~~As for~~ As for now 27 members of parliaments are suspended in order to maintain decorum.
- ② More than 80% of bills are passed in last 5 years without proper discussion.
- ③ Usage of disruption in parliament by opposition which in turn lead to deter functioning of parliament.

Why the concerns are important?

* As far data from Lok Sabha and Rajyasabha the suspension of MPs increased three times compared to previous term.

* whichever party in opposition uses disruption as sole norm to gain publicity rather than using it as least tool to use ^{to} gain attention in parliamentary discussion.

* the farmers protest for more than 1 year is example for inefficient and lack of parliament process in deliberating consequence which can lead to conflicts.

It is hightime to reform the parliamentary process for controlling ruling party ^{sole} authority and opposition party ^{to} losing its standard to act as checker of government's anarchy.
